Construction & Reconstruction of Mutianyu Great Wall

Mutianyu Great Wall had been built since the Northern Qi Dynasty (A.D. 550-577).

The historical documents showed that at the beginning of Ming Dynasty (A.D. 1368-1644), Zhu Yuanzhang (the Emperor of Ming Dynasty) assigned General Xu Da to continue to build the Great Wall on the relic of Northern Qi Dynasty and built Mutianyu Pass.

In A.D. 1568, Zhu Zaihou, another emperor of Ming Dynasty assigned General Qi Jiguang (famous general in anti-Japanese pirates wars) to repair the 2,000-li Great Wall, including Mutianyu Great Wall. Qi finished his work in A.D. 1571. Mutianyu Great Wall has been well preserved up to now, which is the best-preserved segment of the Great Wall relics in Ming Dynasty.



Protect The Great Wall, Protect The Cultural Heritage of The World

The Great Wall is one of the best-preserved wonders and the most important cultural heritages in the world. China has paid attention to its protection long time ago. New China carried out the first batch of maintenance and repair works in 1952. Dec. 1987 saw the Great Wall to be listed among World Cultural Heritage. The State Council passed Rules on Protection of The Great Wall on Sep. 20, 2006. On May 25, 2006, Mutianyu Great Wall was listed among the National Key Cultural Relics Protection Units.
